

anticipation of Christmas. Lighting the candles in darkness is a powerful experience and delivers the strong message that Christ is the Light of the World. You can make up your own prayers each day as you gather around the wreath, or choose to use one of the following and supplement them with Scripture readings of the day.

Week One: O God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. Amen.




FURTHER EXTENSION OF DISPENSATION FROM SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION




