



Catholics over the age of 14 years are to abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent.


SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

During the season of Lent, we tend to think more of sin. Of the seven deadly sins, pride is one that can be good or bad. Having appropriate pride in your achievements is always a good thing, excessive pride in your accomplishments is not. It is when we move from thinking "I have done this well" (always with God's help) to thinking "I am the only one who could do this" that we enter the realm of sin. Pride is a deadly sin because it refuses to acknowledge our reliance on God and gives all credit to ourselves. Whenever we place God outside our experience, we are surely in danger of being in the realm of sin.

You can think of it like this: a grain of wheat needs water, but if it only gets water, it is bloated and will not grow. It needs light, but if it only gets sunlight, it will not grow. But planted in the earth, the grain of wheat dies to itself. Then, surrounded by moisture and seeking the light, the grain of wheat grows, properly nurtured by everything around it. If we rely only on ourselves, our pride leads us to a false sense of importance, and a sure occasion of sin.

All of our COVID 19 protocols continue as we gather for worship. Masking and social distancing are a must. Our present regulations allow for 50% capacity in our churches, and you may notice more persons here. We are glad so many are being vaccinated, but that does not mitigate the need to be cautious. We will keep you apprised of what we are doing in this regard, and how we can all keep one another safe.

I pray that no envy and malice, no hatred or fear, may smother the flame.



"All our sins are traceable to **seven roots**, the **7 Capital Sins**. These 7 sources of sin have been compared to diseases that affect the body. **Pride** is a spiritual cancer that eats and consumes the vital life. **Covetousness** is like spiritual



consumption or tuberculosis, wasting away the soul's inner powers. Lust is a spiritual leprosy. Anger is a delirious fever. Envy is spiritual blood-poisoning. Gluttony leads to a sleeping-sickness that may end in death. Sloth is like a paralysis of the soul that hinders its progress and causes neglect of the means of grace, indifference and even final impenitence. It is pride and sloth that are the parents of final impenitence.

True understanding of the nature and effects of the Capital sins is the first step in combating them. Let us take up arms now and go to the battle! We will be what we **will** to be!"



The daughter of a wealthy Philadelphia international banker, **Katherine Drexel** was a well educated, well traveled young lady. However, she was drawn to the plight of the American Indians and began a systematic aid to Indian missions. In

1889 she wrote, "The feast of St. Joseph brought me the grace to give the remainder of my life to the Indians and the Colored." In 1892 she and her first band of nuns opened a boarding school in Santa Fe. By 1942 she had a system of black Catholic schools in 13 states, 40 mission centers, and 23 rural schools. In all she established 50 mission for Indians in 16 states. She founded Xavier U. in New Orleans, the first university in the U. S, for black students. She died in 1955 at 96 and was canonized in 2000. "The patient and humble endurance of the cross-whatever nature it may be-is the highest work we have to do."

A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE

The apostles thought they knew Jesus, but when he changed in front of them at the Transfiguration, they were "afraid." In families we cannot freeze relationships because change and growth are inevitable. Children grow up, parents grow old, and spouses change. Transfigurations are all around us and within us. Relationships can only grow when we embrace the new and let go of the old.



LIFE AT CONCEPTION ACT

When the Supreme Court handed down its Roe v. Wade decision, it did so based on the previously undefined "right of privacy." Never did the Court declare abortion itself to be a Constitutional right. Instead the Court said: "We need not resolve the difficult question of when life begins...." "If this suggestion of personhood is established, the appellant's case [Roe], of course, collapses, for the fetus' right to life is then guaranteed specifically by the [14th] Amendment."

The 14th Amendment states, "...nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty or property, without due process of law, nor <u>deny to any person</u> within its jurisdiction the <u>equal protection of the law</u>."

That is exactly what a **Life at Conception Act** would do. It declares unborn children "persons" as defined by the 14th Amendment, entitled to legal protection. This is the one thing the Supreme Court admitted in Roe v. Wade that would cause the case for legal abortion to "collapse." When the bill comes up for a vote in Congress, (if it is brought to the floor) it is crucial to have the full weight of an informed public backing the pro-life position.

MASS CANCELLATIONS DUE TO WEATHER

Previously, we relied on the Milford Public Schools, since our own school follows their lead. However, the public schools in most situations involving inclement weather, resort to remote learning, where the students stay home but go on-line for their school day.


