Generally, the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's love for each member of this or her family.

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love, affection and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will enhance your family's time together during the Christmas season.



The Meaning of the Advent Wreath

It is the season of Advent, when we prepare for the coming of the Lord. The wreath is a circle, with no beginning and no end, a symbol of God's eternal love, the immortality of the soul and the everlasting life found in Christ. It is make of various evergreens, signs of continuous life: laurel which signifies victory over persecution and suffering; pine holly & yew: immortality; and cedar: strength & healing. Holly has a special Christian symbolism: the prickly leaves remind us of the crown of thorns and the red berries the blood of our Savior.

The Wreath's four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three of them, those for the 1st, 2nd & 4th weeks, are purple, a color of repentance. The rose candle is lit on Gaudete Sunday, the 3rd Sunday of Advent, when we rejoice: we have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, and are so close to Christmas. The progressive lighting of the candles has meaning also: Our expectations grows, or hope increases as we draw nearer to the celebration of Christ's first coming in Bethlehem on Christmas morning.
