MUSIC FOR THE CELEBRATION AND BLESSING OF A MARRIAGE



The Celebration of a Marriage is a joyous occasion in the life of the couple and in the life of the church. The Catholic Church draws upon its rich artistic heritage, making use of music both recent and ancient, in order to express the solemnity and elation of this joining together.

What follows is a description of when and where music is used in the Marriage Service and a sampling of popular selections for each of the corresponding segments of the liturgy.

Pre-Service Music (Prelude)

It is common to have 25-30 minutes of music before the start of the service. This is usually played at the organ; however, other instrumental music (e.g. string quartet, solo violin, flute, etc.) can be used in place of or along with the organ. As this music is essentially a small recital, it can comprise several different pieces to reflect the different emotional facets of the occasion. The final 2-3 pieces of this pre-service music will be used to seat the mothers, followed by the wedding party. Whether you choose to use one piece for both, or a separate piece for each seating is left to your discretion. The final piece of the pre-service music is that for the procession of the bride. While the piece(s) for the seating of the mothers and the party is usually of a solemn nature, the bride's music can be either boisterous or meditative.

Music during the Service (Offertory, Communion)

At the presentation of the gifts, a hymn or solo piece may be sung. It is common to select a hymn (or other piece of music) whose text centers upon the theme of love, marriage, constancy, etc. These same guidelines apply to music at Communion, with the additional option of selecting a Eucharistically themed hymn or solo.

Procession out (Postlude)

The procession of the bride, groom, and wedding party out of the church is most often accompanied by the organ. At this point, the mood reflected is one of joy and celebration. A great body of repertoire exists to service this need.

Guidelines for Selecting Music

There is an enormous body of music available to you to help you celebrate this special moment in your lives. You need not feel limited by the offerings below. If you would like to request something outside of these usual selections, please feel free to make an appointment with the Director of Music.

Please know that some requests cannot be honored. While there is no ban music from the popular vein, much of it is unsuitable for



the solemnity of the occasion either by reason of text, tone, or association. A good rule of thumb would be to imagine whether your selection would sound out of place at a Mass on Sunday.

Outside Musicians

If you would like to bring your own musician to perform at your wedding, we will be happy to accommodate you! St. Mary's loft has hosted many gifted friends and relatives, each contributing that personal touch that helps to make the day that much more memorable.

All outside musicians must arrange to meet and rehearse with the Director of Music prior to the date of your wedding. All repertoire must be submitted for approval by the Director of Music no later than **one month** prior to the date of your wedding.

Guest Singers may wish to sing either a part of or the entirety of the service. If your guest singer would like to sing only one or two selections, our cantor will perform the rest of the service. If, however, you would like your guest singer to perform the entire service, we ask that you give us at least **six weeks** notice.

Other outside musicians (singers, trumpeters, string quartets, etc...) can be contracted for you through the Director of Music. Please contact the church at least **two months** prior to make these arrangements.

Our Musicians


